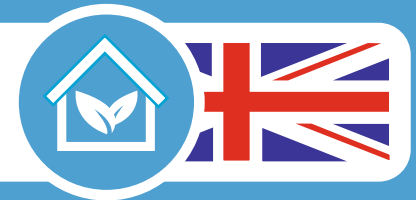

The Energy Efficiency Infrastructure Group's Manifesto: TOMORROW'S HOMES TODAY has 6 key pledges, backed by business.

Over ten years these policies will drive down fuel bills, modernise our homes, and see sustained investment in jobs, communities and companies.

- 1. Deliver warm and comfortable homes for the British people** by giving building owners incentives to insulate and modernise their properties sooner rather than later, cutting energy demand alongside cleaner heat.
- 2. Unblock sector delivery** and drive quality building work, by streamlining standards, setting simple eligibility requirements for funding schemes, and giving more flexibility for skilled retrofit teams on the ground.
- 3. Leverage local delivery** by giving local authorities, who know their area best, the support they need to roll-out robust retrofit programmes across the country.
- 4. Make fuel poverty a thing of the past** by continuing and expanding energy efficiency funding schemes.
- 5. Provide quality, locally-relevant consumer advice** through a network of virtual hubs in every region, bringing together expertise from local authorities, consumer groups, energy companies, manufacturers and local businesses and retrofit professionals.
- 6. Lock in energy savings** down the line with building energy performance standards to complete Tomorrow's Homes and secure the government's targets.
